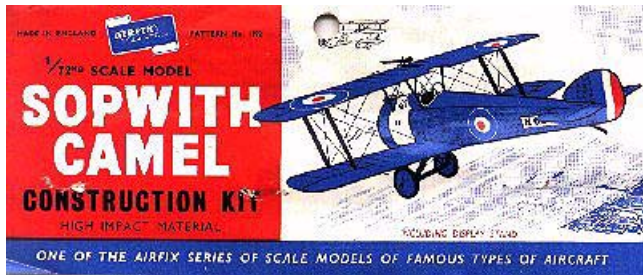

Sopwith 2F1 "Camel"
